

As Professor and Head of the Radio Navigation Group at The University of Wales, Bangor, David Last has led a research team working on terrestrial-based radio navigation systems and the safe and effective transition to Differential GNSS services. He has taught several PhD and post-doctorate students, many of whom have subsequently made significant contributions in the public and private sectors worldwide.
